General Manager's Report September 2026

Board of Directors,

The following report summarizes District operations, maintenance activities, regulatory compliance, infrastructure work, and administrative planning since the previous Board meeting.

SCADA System Implementation

- The District's Ignition SCADA program has been successfully installed and is currently being tested.
- I have been actively testing the system and, so far, have been very impressed with its capabilities and functionality.
- Testing will continue to confirm that the system is operating as intended and to identify any adjustments that may be needed.

Distribution System and Leak Monitoring

- Previously identified leaks throughout the District continue to be monitored.
- No additional leak-related issues or concerns have been identified during this reporting period.
- Staff will continue monitoring the system and addressing any issues as they arise.

Fire Hydrant — Greenhorn Road and Red Bluff

- I will investigate the condition of the fire hydrant located at the corner of Greenhorn Road and Red Bluff.
- I will obtain quotes from local contractors for repair or replacement and provide the available options and costs to the Board.

State Water Testing and Compliance

- All required State water-testing results received this month were clear, with no issues identified.
- The District remains in good standing with its routine water-quality monitoring requirements.

Main Valve Mapping and Location

- Michael continues mapping and locating main valves throughout the District.
- This work will improve our ability to quickly identify and isolate sections of the distribution system during future leaks, repairs, or emergencies.
- Michael has been a great help with this effort, and the system documentation being developed will be valuable for future operations.

District-Wide Manual Meter Reading

- We are planning several days to manually read all meters throughout the District and update baseline meter data for the District's accountant.
- This will also help identify unusual usage, potential leaks, meter issues, or other conditions that may not currently be apparent.

Hazard Mitigation and Grant Funding

- I am communicating with the local hazard mitigation team to determine whether the District can gain membership or otherwise participate in the local hazard mitigation process.
- Participation may improve eligibility for future hazard-mitigation grant funding.
- I will provide the Board with updates as soon as additional information becomes available.
