1. Roll Call:

The meeting is called to order.
Chief Tyson Rael is present.

2. Public Comment:

There are no public comments.

3. Appointment of Directors:

The Plumas County Board of Supervisors made three appointments to the Greenhorn Creek CSD at the meeting held on April 28, 2026:

Kristina Rogers, Brittini Wade and Peter Hoffman.

Rogers states that she was appointed by the Board without her permission (as per recommendation of Supervisor Engel) and she will be working to be unappointed by the Board.

Brittini Wade and Peter Hoffman are given the oath of office by Rebecca Herrin.

There is discussion regarding the process of appointing other directors to fill vacancies. Nicole Hubbell agrees to serve on the Board and is appointed by the new sitting Board of Directors. Nicole is given the oath of office by Brittini Wade.

Fred McGrew is in attendance and indicates that he is willing to serve on the Board. He will submit a letter indicating his willingness to serve. *(Received)*.

Rogers will research who submitted applications to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors appointed three members to provide a quorum and the new Board may now appoint two more members to fill the vacancies (plus one more when Kristina Rogers resigns or is unappointed by the Board of Supervisors).

Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, Allen Hiskey, forwarded applications to Kristina Rogers. Besides those already appointed, the other applicants were Nicole Hubbell, Paige Connell, and Jade Pratt.

4. Water Department:

A. Update on Water System Issues.

General Manager Anthony Campbell has submitted a report to the Board for review.

5. Fire Department:

B. Update on Fire Department Activity.

Chief Rael provides an update. The staffing level is currently 4 firefighters. For three or four days last week, there were no firefighters available, due to various issues.

The community burn pile has not yet been opened. Someone has dumped trash at the site; this is an ongoing issue as there is no fencing or gate. In the past, when burning the pile, firefighters from outside the District (Quincy) have been recruited to assist with the safe burning. A contractor is hired to grade the pile. Costs are approximately \$1000 to \$1400 per year.

CALFIRE personnel may be able to play a role in the burning.

There is discussion regarding charging a fee for dumping, monitoring the pile to prevent issues with dumping or leaving items unsuitable for burning, as it is currently an honor system. The pile remains closed and may remain closed for the remainder of the year.

The road to the burnpile needs to be graded but it is unclear who is responsible for the dirt road at the end of the subdivision road Blackridge. Rebecca Herrin volunteers to do some research.

6. Adjournment to the special meeting scheduled for Monday, June 22, 2026 at 6 pm.

There is discussion regarding the possibility of livestreaming the meetings. Rael responds that a conference call hub would have to be obtained, but it is possible.
